Enjoy this sensory exploration of the natural world. On a hike, we will highlight animal families, trees, and plants.



Plants and Seeds

Learn the parts of a plant, parts of a flower, and how flowers turn to seeds with this hands-on lesson. We will be searching the trails for the flowers in bloom and seeds as we go.

Animal Homes

Hike the trails in search of animal homes and learn about different types of animals that live in them.

Learn about the water cycle, water conservation, and the importance of wetlands. Through pond scooping, explore the secrets of the water world.

Stewardship Project

Learn about invasive species and how they impact our native communities. Determine a plan of action of how to control the spread of invasive species.

Bugs Badge

Learn the parts of an insect, the different mouth parts, where they live, and their role in their environment. Activities include pond scooping, insect netting in the prairie, and a butterfly craft.

Energize Your World

Flowers Badge
